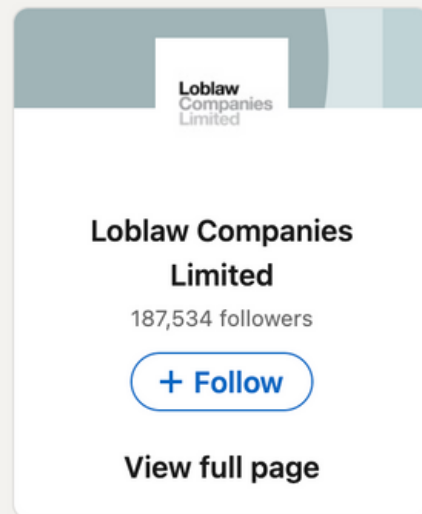



And, like many others, I am aware of the inhumane treatment of CAGED HENS in your supply chain. These hens suffer terribly every moment of every day as they produce your EGGS. 
